**MUNHUUSH TODAY**

Some of you may remember Munhuush. It was 4 years and 2 months ago that Dolgar, one of our Bible translators, came to work with the most heartbreaking news a mother in Mongolia could have. Her 18 month old baby boy had brain cancer. She had just been told by the Mongolian doctors to take him home and wait for the inevitable. The previous summer the MacMed Team had come to Mongolia and most all of them had met Doggie (Dolgar) and Munhuush. We contacted them with the news and sent his cat scans. In just over one week, with the help of two team members, Munhuush had been accepted for treatment at St Jude's Hospital. It took another four days to get Doggie and Munhuush visas for the trip to St Jude. All the time Munhuush is getting visibly worse. What a relief to finally see them off from Mongolia International airport, only to have them not allowed on the flight from Korea to the USA because he had gotten worse. After a night in the Korean hospital



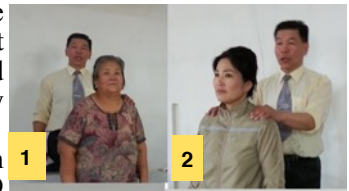
he was allowed to fly the next day, only to make a turn for the worse during the flight. God provided an emergency room nurse on the flight and also a pilot who was willing to turn over his radio to a doctor at St. Jude. The doctors at St. Jude said he arrived with only hours to live. That was 4 years ago the end of March. This week he walked into our building by his own power, and is now attending preschool. There has been plenty of struggles to get him to this point and many more to come, but what a blessing to see him doing so well. Thank you to all who helped in saving Munhuush's life.

1. Dugersurengiin Tsermaa, female, 58 years old. I heard the gospel for the first time, while I was in hospital, from Khaltar, a member of the church.

2. Altangereliin Tsetsegkhorol, female, 49 years old.

I came to the church by myself. Sister Ulzii, who was preparing a lesson for next Sunday school, shared the gospel to me.



I'd been looking for holiness in my heart. I went to many places but couldn't find the truth. After talking to sister Ulzii, I thought to myself that I needed to attend the abuse program. There I found about God's holiness and that I needed salvation. And I became believer in Jesus Christ.

3. Bekhbatyn Siilegmaa, female, 15 years old. I used to go to a church. But my mother, her name is Enkhee, invited me to the Bayanzurkh Altad Baptist Church, which she attends. There I learnt about God's salvation and accepted Christ as my savior.

4. Unurkhaany Enkhee, female, 45 years old. First time, I heard the gospel from Enkhtuya, my colleague and convinced that Christ was real. My supervisor Nayanbaatar, manager Narandelger and steward Bat-Erdene also gave great influence. When I had a difficult situation, Enkhtuya advised me to talk to sister Ulzii. During the conversation I thought that I had to attend the abuse class.

When I went in the church for the first time, I saw Matthew 28:18-20 on the wall and believed that the Lord any nation. I'm Kazakh and my parents are Islam. I accepted Jesus as my savior and so did my daughter Siilegmaa. We became members of the same church.
